0 INTRODUCTION

In today's technology, a number of different types of addressing systems are used which employ equipment and address masters. This International Standard is a first attempt to work towards rationalizing the existing capacity of address masters.

1 SCOPE AND FIELD OF APPLICATION

This International Standard specifies the minimum line and character capacity of address masters.
